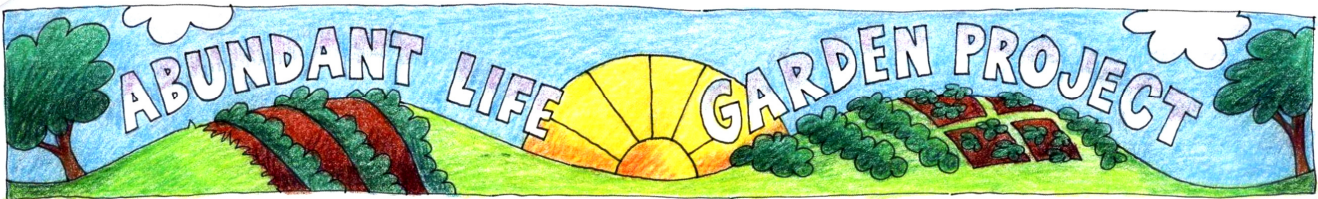


## Christian Formation Programs
