With sustained winds of 165 miles per hour, Hurricane Ivan killed at least 68 people as it passed through the Caribbean.

Earlier in the season two hurricanes struck Florida:

- More than 12,500 homes were destroyed;
- 120,000 people were displaced.

Much of the damage in Florida was to the homes and lives of the elderly. Thousands of elderly couples on fixed incomes lived in mobile homes which have been destroyed or seriously damaged.
